I use my eyes to look at my colorful painting.




I use my eyes to view the Kindergarten Halloween parade.

I use my ears to listen to my teacher.




I use my ears to hear the sounds of the musical instruments in the Kindergarten Halloween Parade.



I use my ears to listen to Grady sing a song.




I use my ears to hear stories and sounds on the listening station.

I use my nose to inhale the odors of sea air, salt water, and fish.






I use my mouth to taste crunchy, salty Doritoes.
